**SECTION 52 (1) DETERMINATION NO 4 - 2015
12 October 2015**

1. PURPOSE

This determination is made to assist the implementation of the Wellbeing Framework for Schools to provide enhanced student wellbeing services and to allow the recruitment of additional school psychologists to be available at the start of the 2016 school year.

2. SCOPE


- 2.1 This Determination is made pursuant to S52 (1) of the Government Sector Employment Act 2013. It provides for the classification and salary of the position of School Psychologist and Senior Psychologist, Education. It shall apply to staff employed as School Psychologist and Senior Psychologist, Education within the Department of Education (without teacher qualifications). It shall take effect on and from 12 October 2015 and shall remain in effect until 12 October 2017.
- 2.2 Except as expressly provided by this Determination, the conditions of employment for staff employed in classifications contained in Clause 3 Classifications and Salaries of this Determination are governed by the provisions of the *Government Sector Employment Act 2013* and the *Crown Employees (Public Service Conditions of Employment) Reviewed Award 2009* and any successor instruments.

3. CLASSIFICATIONS AND SALARIES
